The University of Waterloo School of Optometry & Vision Science, in the Faculty of Science, is seeking qualified applicants for a full-time position in the faculty category of clinical lecturer, in the area of **Primary Care**. Additional experience in specialty contact lens is desirable but not required. The position is a 3-year definite term with an option of future continuing appointment. The University Optometry Clinics include primary care and specialty clinics that encompass the full spectrum of the contemporary practice of optometry. The successful candidate will be passionate about teaching, clinical education, patient care, and the profession of optometry.

The successful candidate will have completed a residency or have 3 or more years of clinical experience. The expectation is to grow the School's primary care clinic. Assignments will include evenings, after-hours on-call services and some Saturday clinics.

The range of duties includes intern supervision, resident supervision, and direct patient care. Clinical lecturers are expected to participate in activities that contribute to the effective functioning of the School such as administrative duties and service on committees.

Applicants should be eligible for a general or an academic certificate of registration with the College of Optometrists of Ontario. Applicants would ideally be available to start by November 2021.

Salary is negotiable within a range of \$95,000 to \$120,000 commensurate with experience and qualifications.
